4. Malachi tells us we must guard the covenant of our marriage. What are the things that threaten to attack the covenant that we have to guard against? How do we practically guard the covenant?
5. In what ways are two people in a marriage relationship incompatible? How does the Bible tell us they are compatible? (See Genesis 2:18) Which has the greater importance and weight when it comes to seeing our way through differences? Why and how does it make a difference to believe this?
6. In Genesis 2:23-24 it tells us that marriage “unites” or “cleaves” us together, meaning we become glued together. What are examples of true connection? What are examples of false connection?
7. Write down five things you could do that would make your marriage or a relationship you are in better.
8. What are you going to do this week to strengthen and deepen your marriage or a relationship you are in? (Remember, the more specific you are in what you will do and when you will do it, the more likely it will happen.) Who can you ask to hold you accountable to following through?
