- Two Problems : i) Over Promising ii) Deceptive Promising

- **But I Tell You...**

"But I say, do not make any vows! Do not say, 'By heaven!' because heaven is God's throne. And do not say, 'By the earth!' because the earth is his footstool. And do not say, 'By Jerusalem!' for Jerusalem is the city of the great King. Do not even say, 'By my head!' for you can't turn one hair white or black. Just say a simple, 'Yes, I will,' or 'No, I won't.' Anything beyond this is from the evil one."

EXPLORING TOGETHER

There is value in sharing perspectives about the weekend message in community. With dialogue around God’s truths, perspective broadens and impacts transformation.

1. What is something from this weekend's message that stood out to you? How so?
2. How would you describe the difference between **wrestling with God** and **fighting against God**?

TAKING IT HOME

In this week's text, Jesus spoke about honesty and called his followers to raise the bar on integrity. To fully grasp what Jesus was saying here, **first-century Middle Eastern context and culture needs to be understood**. The concept of honesty, swearing an oath, or making a solemn promise, was serious business in the time of Jesus.

3. Do you think people are more, or less, honest these days compared to previous decades?
4. What experience have you had of being treated dishonestly? How did it affect you?
5. Is there ever an occasion when telling the truth is unnecessary or not required?

In Jesus day people were misrepresenting the concept of an oath with **frivolous swearing**, in which language of the sacred used for the wrong purpose lost its significance. Also in the ludicrous legalism leading up to that time, some oaths were deemed binding, while others allowed for the wiggle room of **evasive swearing**.

6. Some people (Christians among them) use the name of "God" or "lord" as a figure of speech—and sometimes as an expletive. How appropriate is this?

WEEKLY REFLECTION

According to Jesus: a promise is a promise, and an oath is an oath. Whether in writing or by invoking the name of God, in the presence of a hundred witnesses or none, it does not matter. **For the man or woman who follows Jesus, their word is their bond.**

7. Why do you think Jesus says that sacred oaths are unnecessary for the Christian?
8. Below are 5 markers Pastor David mentioned for being a **Person Of Your Word**. In which area(s) do you most struggle? In which are you strongest?

Show up. Do the hard stuff. Be safe. Be selfless. Be real.

Surrender - Follow - Listen - Do (2 Corinthians 5:21, John 8:36, Luke 19:10)
