3. In light of this week's message, how would you define biblical "witness"?
4. What experience have you had in sharing your faith in Jesus with others? What made it challenging? What made it a blessing?
5. In this week's passage we see that Peter addressed his Jewish audience in a manner that they would understand. How does societal culture impact the way in which you talk to others about what Jesus has done in your life?

TAKING IT HOME

Like the early Christians, "witnesses" are simply people who know, telling people who don't know, what God has made possible through the death, resurrection, and Lordship of his Son, Jesus Christ. We do not need to be brilliant theologians to go about God's mission of spreading the good news. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus-followers can proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.

6. Read John 13:34-35. How does this relate to this week's passage verses 42-47?
7. How does the Acts description of the early church compare with the church today? How does your Life Group (or other connection relationships) correlate with it?
8. Taking all that you have considered this week, what is the one important thing for you to remember and put into action?
