The Problem of Hypocrisy - Matthew 7:1-5

- **“You’re all a bunch of hypocrites!”**

- **The Problem of Hypocrisy**

- the practice of claiming to have moral standards or beliefs to which one's own behavior does not conform

“Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. For you will be treated as you treat others. The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be judged.

And why worry about a speck in your friend’s eye when you have a log in your own? How can you think of saying to your friend, ‘Let me help you get rid of that speck in your eye,’ when you can’t see past the log in your own eye?

Hypocrite! First get rid of the log in your own eye; then you will see well enough to deal with the speck in your friend’s eye.

Matthew 7:1-5 NLT

- **Misaligned Beliefs and Behaviors**

What we do....

- i) Hide Them: Legalism, The Masked Life
- ii) Justify Them
- iii) Flaunt Them
- v) Grieve over them (2 Corinthians 7:10, NLT)

- **Integrity**

- the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles; moral uprightness, *the state of being whole and undivided*
- Where we are unwhole and divided is where we need:

- **The Hypocrisy of Love**

- A. Love is lived by being a person of Grace and Mercy

Grace - getting what you don't deserve. undeserved favor

Mercy - not getting what you deserve.

- B. The scandal of the Gospel of Jesus Christ is it is hypocritical - you're getting what you don't deserve and you're not getting what you do deserve.

- **Surrender - Follow - Listen - Do**

- A. **Surrender** your position as the Gold Standard, as judge

- B. **Follow** Jesus' example of love lived

- be a person of grace and mercy

- C. **Listen** to the voice of Jesus when tempted to judge

- He touched people with compassion

- D. **Do** the Good News of Jesus.
