UNSHAKABLY GRATEFUL

"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward."

EXPLORING TOGETHER

There is value in sharing perspectives about the weekend message in community. With dialogue around God’s truths, perspective broadens and impacts transformation.

1. What is something from this weekend’s message that stood out to you? How so?

TAKING IT HOME

2. How do you decide which kinds of charitable causes you support? How important is it to know where donated money to charitable causes is used?
3. Some interpret verse 1 as saying that faith is purely private and not something others should see. Do you agree? What do you think Jesus’ point was in this verse?
4. How do you feel about public acts of righteousness (like giving to needy causes)? Take into consideration the current time we live in, ex: GoFundMe / Facebook Random Acts of Kindness page, etc. Is it wrong for others to notice those acts?

5. How does God give us the blessings/resources/giftedness that he wants us to show toward others—even our enemies?
6. Read Acts 2:44-45 and Acts 4:34-35. How applicable are these amazing examples of sharing to our situation in the twenty-first century? What is the timeless principle we should apply now?

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Within every Christ-follower is everything required to treat other people the way God does—even, if not especially, those who treat us as enemies. It is a potential within all of God’s children. All we need to do is activate it and show the family likeness.

Surrender - Follow - Listen - Do (2 Corinthians 5:21, John 8:36, Luke 19:10)

- The Gospel - the Good News of Jesus - is that we are forgiven by God. Because we are forgiven, through the Spirit of God we have been given the power to forgive.
 - No forgiveness, no freedom.
 - In forgiveness, there is freedom.
 - Freedom to love and be loved.

8. Jesus teaches us that it is not about the act of worship (or spiritual practice) but about the motive behind the act of worship. In light of this week’s message, what do you need to *surrender, follow, listen* or *do in order to be more generous*?
